




Sisters of Providence

About Us

More than 175 years ago Emilie Gamelin, a young widow in Montreal, Canada, was moved to serve the many poor, hungry and sick people who lived around her. Responding to the call of religious life, she founded the Sisters of Providence. Her example inspired others to support her efforts. In 1856, Mother Joseph of the Scared Heart and four other Sisters of Providence traveled to the Pacific Northwest establishing schools, hospitals, orphanages and other homes of care for those in need.

The legacy of compassion and good works established by Blessed Emilie Gamelin (beatified in 2001) and Mother Joseph lives on, guiding those called to share their lives as Sisters of Providence. Contemporary sisters pursue the same goals as Mother Gamelin, while keeping pace with the changes in society today. The Sisters of Providence are urged by the love of Christ and inspired by Mary, Our Mother of Sorrows, to respond to those who suffer, particularly individuals and groups whose basic needs are not met, and those who are rejected, marginalized and voiceless.

Sisters of Providence International serves Argentina, Cameroon, Canada, Chile, Egypt, El Salvador, the United States, Haiti and the Philippines. Sisters of Providence, Mother Joseph Province, serves the western states of Alaska, Oregon, California, Idaho, Montana and Washington, as well as El Salvador and the Philippines.
